What is the Southeast Greenway?

The greenway is comprised of approximately 57 acres of undeveloped land owned by the California Department of Transportation, originally for the extension of Highway 12, located in southeast Santa Rosa. The land follows a linear 1.9-mile long path extending from Farmers Lane to Spring Lake Regional Park.

What is this project about?

This project involves identifying appropriate land uses for the site, improving connections, formalizing the land use plan through an amendment to the City's General Plan, and rezoning the property to allow for new uses. The potential uses being considered are:

- Parks and open space
- Neighborhood Retail
- Recreational facilities
- Housing

Who is involved?

The City of Santa Rosa is part of the Southeast Greenway Community Partnership, comprised of the City, Sonoma County Regional Parks, Sonoma County Water Agency, LandPaths, Southeast Greenway Campaign, and Sonoma Land Trust. The Partnership has been actively engaged in a collaborative effort to facilitate and achieve the transfer of the Southeast Greenway to local ownership for public and other uses.
